HAPPY VALENTINE'S DAY! By Pastor Don Gibson

If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and surrender my body to the flames, but have not love, I gain nothing. (1 Corinthians 13:1–3)


Often, there is not much to celebrate in February. For many of us, by the time February rolls around, we are tired of winter and ready for spring. Valentines Day is one of the only things that many of us look forward to in February. Valentine's Day is the day in which we celebrate love. Valentine's Day is named after Saint Valentine, a Catholic priest who lived in Rome in the 3rd Century. There are many stories about Saint Valentine and over time these stories grew into the legend we know today. At the time of Valentine's life, many Romans were converting to Christianity, but the Emperor Claudius II was a pagan and created strict laws about what Christians were allowed to do. Claudius believed that Roman soldiers should be completely devoted to Rome and therefore passed a law preventing them from getting married. Saint Valentine began to marry these soldiers in secret Christian ceremonies, and this was the beginning of his reputation for believing in the importance of love. Eventually, Valentine was found out and jailed for his crimes against Claudius. While imprisoned, Valentine cared for his fellow prisoners and also

his jailor's blind daughter.

His final act before being executed was to write her (the jailor's daughter) a message signed 'from your Valentine'. Valentine was executed on February 14 in the year 270 AD.

This year, on February 14, and throughout the entire month, let us be reminded of what Jesus said when asked what the greatest commandment is: "The most important one," answered Jesus, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these." (Mark 12:29) Love. That's what it all boils down to for us




ATTENTION ALL WOMEN

PRIDE OF THE SOUTH PECAN PIE

1 (9 inch) pie shell

1 cup pecan halves

3 eggs

1 cup light Karo Syrup

1 Tablespoon melted butter

½ teaspoon vanilla

½ cup white sugar

1 Tablespoon flour

- Arrange pecan halves in pie shell.
- Beat eggs. Add light Karo syrup, melted butter and vanilla, blend.
- · Combine sugar and flour.
- Blend with egg mixture and pour over nuts in pie shell.
- Let stand until nuts rise, so they get a good glaze while baking.
- · Bake 45 minutes at 350 degrees
