This Day Belongs to The Lord – New Year Reflection

This day belongs to the Lord! Let us celebrate and be glad. During our staff Christmas party, we were given a daily devotional book by Sarah Young. The devotional was warmly received and deeply appreciated, because we all recognize how beneficial it is for our souls and minds to intentionally spend time alone with God. Yet, if we are honest, we often neglect to faithfully practice such spiritual disciplines. Because of this, each year I make it a personal commitment to choose a Bible verse—and one or two guiding words—that will anchor me throughout the coming year. I have been doing this for the past seven years, and I can truly say that this practice has helped me remain strong and focused on my walk with the Lord. After reading the first devotion of the new year, I knew exactly where my search was leading me. I chose Psalm 118:24 as my guiding verse for the new year. This time, I was especially drawn to the wording found in the Complete Jewish Bible, which reads: "This is the day Adonai has made, a day for us to rejoice and be glad." From this verse, two words caught my attention: Rejoice and Celebrate. These two words will remind me of God's purpose for my life and for my family in the year ahead. I do not know what this new year will bring. I am unaware of the challenges that may come my way.

But of this I am certain: the One who created each day and blessed it is the Lord God Almighty, God the Creator. Every day belongs to Him, and every day is an invitation to acknowledge that amid the unknown, we can still rejoice and be glad in the Lord. To rejoice and celebrate means recognizing that throughout our earthly journey, God is with us. Was not Emmanuel—“God with us”—the name we heard repeatedly throughout Advent and the Christmas season? Why should we stop rejoicing and celebrating that truth now? The same God who made all things continues to make new things. Last year, the title of the Christmas play written by Deborah was both catchy and deeply hopeful: “God Is Up to Something.” As we enter this new year, remember God is still up to something; therefore, let us prepare our hearts for what the Lord has in store—things I believe are greater than any uncertainty or challenge we may face. This is the day that the Lord has made—a day to rejoice in His presence and to be glad that we belong to Him. We are God’s, and His plans are perfect and full of purpose.

MISSION MINUTE

Our blanket drive to benefit the International Rescue Committee refugees was a great success. We were able to donate 82 blankets, and sheet sets for twin, full, and queen-size beds. A great “Thank You” from the IRC was expressed.

Our donations to Sherbourne Food Pantry for 2025 (so far) are 8279 pounds worth of food. We still have a couple more weeks for donations, so that number should increase.

The Beulah Mission team voted to increase our food goal for 2026 to 7000+ pounds. As I am writing, we are nearing the end of the year. We have asked all the small groups, Sunday school classes, Women’s Circles, and Men’s Group to send us a record of their donations to missions, local or foreign and the amount. We want to be able to tell our church how we have supported others through the love of Jesus Christ. Our hope is to share a total to our Beulah family by February.

Beulah Church has also adopted a village with the Friends of Barnabas. This is a 3- year commitment. The community of Plancitos de Suyapa was founded over 50 years ago. Coffee, corn, and beans are grown locally and sold. The monthly income for the average family in Plancitos is 800 Lempiras (\$32) per week. Information regarding this is posted on the Mission bulletin board (to the left of the elevator in the Fellowship Hall).

The mission team is sponsoring a fun project to support **NOWKenya** girls. It will be **Tuesday, January 6**, in the Fellowship Hall at 9:30 am. Please plan to attend. Requirements: can cut & can tie a knot.



Santa Fe Soup by Barbara Dudley in the "A Taste of Heaven" Cookbook Page 17

2 lbs. hamburger, browned & drained	2 pkgs dry ranch dressing
1 can Rotel tomatoes and green chiles	1 cup water
1 (16 oz) can kidney beans (undrained)	1 (16oz) can pinto beans
1 (16oz) can black beans (undrained)	1 large, peeled potato, cut into chunks
2 cans shoepeg corn (undrained)	2 pkgs taco seasoning
1 (16oz) can diced tomatoes with juice	

Combine all ingredients in a large pot or crockpot. Cook on high 3-5 hours (crockpot only). Add salt and pepper to taste
